The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) prohibits discrimination and ensures equal opportunity for persons with disabilities in employment, state and local government services, public accommodations, commercial facilities, and transportation (http://www.ada.gov/2010_regs.htm).

If you are a person with a disability covered by the ADA and would like to request an accommodation during the arbitration or mediation process, notify the AAA case management staff handling your case.
